From Our Pastor

REOPENING II: Into the Future-Together

Our hybrid worship services continue, having services both online, over FM radio, and in person. The day after our last in-person-only service, we had to radically alter course. COVID-19 forced us to really look at what it means to be The Church what being The Church looks like during a worldwide pandemic.

This strange period we're in made us take a hard look at how we can be The Church in a very new and different world. We were compelled to adapt. We had to change. Oh, it wasn't easy! The best things seldom are. But we did it.

We went from a "normal" worship service on March 15 to worshiping online only just one week later. Since then, we started online Sunday school sessions and held a four week Bible study. We began Zoom committee meetings, too, and our FMtransmitted "Drive-In Church" successfully began. We had to get creative to do things we had taken for granted, things that connected us.

If it wasn't for COVID-19, would we have started online worship? Worship over FM radio? Would we have started holding meetings, Bible studies, and Sunday school sessions on Zoom? Probably not for years is my guess.

Let me take a moment to congratulate you--us-the Mohawk congregation, for doing all that we have done to stay together and safe and active as a

faith community. I have several colleagues who have been on a similar path, but they have had some loud voices of dissention. That hasn't happened here, thank the Lord. I believe it is because we all understand that we're in it together and that we're doing the best we can for one another. As you may have heard me say before, It's okay to disagree, but it's not okay to disagree disagreeably. Thank you for your genuine humility, love, care, and civility toward one another.

In Philippians 2:1-4, Paul seems to have spelled out what we have been doing already: Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the oth-

Our strength is not that we all think alike but that we all think together.

OUR CURRENT GUIDELINES FOR WORSHIP

We do these out of love and care for one another.

- "<u>Drive-In Church</u>" (99.9 on FM radio) and <u>live-stream</u> of worship (Viral Church Channel) are two alternatives instead of in-person worship.
- If you are in one or more of the CDC high-risk categories, are or might be ill, or are just not ready to worship in person, you are encouraged to worship online from home or at Drive-In Church.

IF YOU ARE WORSHIPING IN PERSON:

- Masks must be worn at all times in the building.
- Our entire building is appropriately disinfected/cleaned thoroughly each week.
- Our sanctuary, restrooms, and Fellowship Hall are the only rooms open on Sundays. Everything else is closed.
- Sanctuary seating will be from the front to the rear, and dismissal will be from the rear to the front.
- Our Fellowship Hall is an additional worship area. Chairs are six (6) feet apart, though families may pull chairs closer to sit together.
- Our Administrative Council meets every two weeks to review our situation.
- Guideline changes will be made by a vote of the Administrative Council. The changes will be made known by email, Facebook, and announced in worship.
