THE MESSENGER

[From Our Pastor: Rains of Righteousness, Springs of Salvation]

There's a well-worn saying: "April showers bring May flowers." It reminds me that even gloomy, rainy days serve a purpose—they prepare the earth to bloom. The same is true in our lives. Rains of righteousness bring springs of salvation.

The prophet Isaiah says: "You, heavens above, rain down my righteousness; let the clouds shower it down. Let the earth open wide, let salvation spring up, let righteousness flourish with it; I, the Lord, have created it" (Isaiah 45:8). What a powerful image: righteousness raining down like spring rain, causing salvation to spring up like blossoms from the soil.

Yet how often does it feel like we're living in a spiritual drought? Turn on the news, and you'll hear the same repetitive cycles: violence, division, strife, war, economic uncertainty, and moral decay. It's easy to feel dry and weary. Add to those headlines, daily deadlines, family stress, rising costs, and spiritual monotony, and suddenly our souls can feel parched, almost numb.

But May reminds us: God is still at work beneath the surface.

In these dry seasons, pray for God to send His rains of righteousness, a spiritual downpour that washes away apathy, sin, and hopelessness. Pray for his Word and Presence to soak into the hardened ground of our hearts, homes, communities, and nation. When righteousness rains down, salvation springs forth.

This isn't a call to passive waiting but to persistent prayer and hopeful action. Paul encourages us, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up" (Galatians 6:9). Stand in the gap and plead for heaven's rain, believing that God will bring beauty from ashes, joy from mourning, and new life from barren places.

Just as May flowers make us smile and lift our eyes in gratitude, so too can the blossoms of revival and renewal make our spirits rejoice. God is not done. His righteousness will come, and when it does, salvation will spring forth.
